



Local Evaluation and Planning for 100% Sent Culture and Best Practices on Campus

Purpose: In SLM we regularly evaluate our evangelism and discipleship strategies. But at times we **neglect to evaluate** how we are sending students. Sending isn't solely defined by the number of students who participate in our missional opportunities or become staff members. The central question is if our **engaged and multiplying disciples transition well** and continue launching spiritual movements in their new contexts. **This is how we will see our vision of “Movements Everywhere” become a reality.**

Process: Use the questions below as a starting point to help you **evaluate your current sending efforts and make plans for improvement.** They can be used by **National, Regional, and Local leaders** to assess different levels of the ministry. You can answer these questions with a co-leader if you have one, and then **facilitate a conversation on sending with your whole team.** Take time to reflect on the questions in each section and then pray for the Lord to give you insight on how to move forward.

1. How are we doing?

How are most students doing in their **walk with the Lord after college**? What data do you have on your graduates from the last couple of years?

How are most graduates/alumni doing with their transition to the workplace personally and professionally? Do they think our ministry **prepared them well for that transition**?

- Building *community* with believers/church involvement
- Building deeper, healthy communication/relationships with *Non-believers*
- *Comfortably transitioning* to spiritual topics with non-believing friends
- *Life/Self-Management*, prioritizing, scheduling, budgeting, planning
- Pursuing *personal development*, growth, accountability

How are most **graduates/alumni** translating their **on-campus** ministry training into their adult lives? Do they feel equipped to do evangelism and discipleship in their new settings?

2. What are we already doing?

What are we already doing as a team and individually on campus to move students toward becoming **lifelong multiplying disciples**?

How are we **helping students identify what God is calling them to long term**? How are we **preparing them to thrive and be fruitful** in that mission field? What will they need (head, heart, hands) that we are not providing?

How are we helping them build **relationships with professionals who model living on mission** and share their kingdom vision?

How are they **exposed to opportunities** to serve with CCCi or partner ministries?

3. What do we need to start doing?

How will we equip students to be lifelong multiplying disciples in **their future ministry context**?

With whom will we schedule a **5 things conversation**?

- Who are the **engaged final-year students**? (List names)
- Who are the **engaged faculty**? (List names)
- Who are the **engaged alumni**? (List names)

How can we **help students create a plan to live out His call & their Kingdom vision after graduation**?

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
